3.01 Recommendation to Approve 2022-2023 School Improvement Plans

Last year three year plans were developed for each school. Elementary plan has no real changes other than to increase scores in special education and free and reduced student populations and decrease absences. The Jr./Sr. High School goals are focusting in on Grades 7 and 8 ilearn and math scores, attendance rates, decreasing the amount of students that have F's and increasing the graduation rate.

6.01 Superintendent Report – Parking lot led lights have been installed. There is a break in the line underground between 2 poles. Mr. Bennett asked Mr. Nava to give him a quote on the repair. Also the inground flag light will be repaired. Tremco will be coming on Thursday to talk about the roof over the dome. Hopefully we are getting closer to getting someone to do the warranty work. Mr. Bennett gave a big thank you to the community, teachers, parents, PTA, students to everyone that donted to the playground. Also a big shout out to Jeremiah Patrick for all of the labor he donated on the playground. FFA National Convention is on Thursday.

6.02 Principal's Report – Ms. Quinn reported that the elementary raised \$175 for the Heavenly Hat foundation. Wednesday there will be a community food pantry distribution in the parking lot from 4-6. Set up starts at 12:30 and there will be student volunteers to help with this project. On October 31st at 1:00 there will be the Halloween Parade in the elementary circle (weather permitting). The staff is doing a book study from the book Teaching wth Love and Logic. This study is continuing through professional development time. PTA will meet November 2 at 5:00 in the elementary cafeteria. The Christmas Program will be December 15 at 5:30. The fifth grade band will play at that time so this will be for K-5. The sixth grade band has elected to perform with the Jr. High and High School bands so they will perform on December 5th.

Ms. Duvall reported that the girls basketball team is doing community service cleaning tombstones and the boys basketball team and others will be doing community service by helping with helping to pack boxes for the mobile food pantry. Haunted hallways raised \$748 so they were really excited about that. Study tables will be implemented earlier this year for anyone that needs help. There is a weekly bullying and support group implemented. There will also be a parent education night on bullying.

Mr. Nagai – Asked the high school art teacher to give a bit of an explanation on the National Honor Art Society. She described that it is an academic organization that does community service through art. Mr. Nagia also thanked the PTA for their work on the playground fundraising. He also thank the other board members for their hard work this year.

Mr. Minix – asked about other security issues in the corporation. Mr. Bennett responded that Lazarro had been here checking every exterior door in the system. Some has been fixed and some are waiting for repair parts. Progress is being made in having the safety film installed and the visitor badge kiosk system has arrived and will be installed soon.

Mr. Lady – asked when they could have a timeline on HVAC. Hopefully that will be next week according to Mr. Nagai.

Ms. Ecker – echoed congratulations on the playground project. She was also impressed with Mrs. Marsh's off the cuff explanation on the National Art Honor Society. Ms. Ecker also emphasized the Project 30 meeting is very important to have a good turnout and have questions and be firm in getting answers.
