6.01 Superintendent Report – Very good back to school. Big thank you to custodial staff. Friday will be attending a bargaining workshop. Today adjusted drop-off procedures at high school. Frank on Friday put in portable AC units in elementary school. HVAC is still going through bids to make sure they are accurate.

6.02 Principals Reports – Ms. Quinn said great job to elementary for jump start program she ran. Mr. Minter has researched the National Archery in Schools program so we will have that in PE classes this year. He applied for a grant so it will only cost the school \$500. It will start with grades 4-6 this year. Open House had 92% of families attended elementary school. Thanked everyone for attending the playground dedication. Grandparents/special friends' day is going to return this year on September 29. Our count at the elementary is 323 students. (48 kindergarteners, 14 new to us, preschool has 36, 2 are out of district.)

Ms. DuVall – Excited to have a full staff and two extra paraprofessionals over the last year. Jumpstart was very productive, 24 of the 38 students attended. We do have boys and girls' soccer teams this year. FFA is starting contests already. They have researched varsity sports as a PE credit and will be offering that this year. Currently there are 220 students registered.
