Dual Credit and Vocational Opportunities Available

Oregon-Davis has many vocational opportunities and dual credit options available for students, which prepare students for life after high school. Vocational courses and industry certifications equip students with marketable skills that can be used to get a job after high school graduation. Dual credit courses allow students to earn college credits while still in high school, saving money in two ways: by earning college credit through less expensive courses in high school and by helping students graduate college faster, minimizing the college tuition bill.

O-D students are encouraged to pursue dual credit and vocational opportunities while in high school to prepare for success after graduation, no matter the path they choose.

As students begin to look at scheduling for the 2018-19 school year, they should be aware of the various vocational programs offered. Oregon-Davis Jr-Sr High School has a partnership with the North Central Area Vocational Cooperative (NCAVC) to offer several half-day courses that provide students with an opportunity to earn dual credit through Ivy Tech and Ancilla College, as well as industry certifications. New Lifeguarding Course Offered

Students now have the opportunity to learn how to be a lifeguard. Last summer, Health and PE teacher, Jim Ash, completed lifeguard instructor training through Valparaiso University. As a result, an elective PE course is now offered to students with the aim to become lifeguard certified through the Red Cross. In this course, students learn basic first aid, CPR and demonstrate several rescues. Students must complete classroom work as well as an online blended learning course. Upon completion of this class, students have the requirements needed to become lifeguards.

T'm excited about having the opportunity to teach this course," lifeguarding teacher Jim Ash said. "The skills they learn in Lifeguarding can be used after they graduate from high school."

Students must be over 15 years of age to enroll in this course. If interested in taking this course next year, see Mrs. Ecker during scheduling.

Opportunities Abound for Oregon-Davis Students

Oregon-Davis is committed to providing students with as many opportunities for success as possible.

One of the opportunities available to Oregon-Davis students is the High Ability program. Oregon-Davis School Corporation now offers an enrichment program for students in first through 12th grade, which allows them to brush up on their critical thinking skills, engage in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) activities, and develop their creativity. Sessions are Wednesdays, 2:30 to 5 p.m.

Another program helping students is the Starke County

Youth Club (SCYC), which provides after-school and summer programs to students in K-12th grade. Students in SCYC participate in homework assistance, cultural activities, life skills, recreation and fine arts.

Students interested in fine arts can develop their skills by participating in yearbook and pep band. The pep band is comprised of current high school band members, select junior high band members, past Oregon-Davis band alumni and parent volunteers. They play at all home basketball games and also travel with the basketball teams during sectional and regional games. They are known as "small, but mighty," as they can fill a gym with sounds of just a few players.

Yearbook is a high school course that meets every day during eighth hour. Typical activities include: photography, graphic design, narrative writing and learning about grammar. Interested students must put in a request to their guidance counselor.

There are so many opportunities available to Oregon-Davis students. Take advantage of as many as possible!

Motivational Speaker Visits Oregon-Davis

Staff and students alike were wowed when motivational speaker Jeff Yalden visited Oregon-Davis on Oct. 25. Yalden spoke about living life as a journey while striving for excellence. One of the top youth motivational speakers in education in the world, Yalden suffered from low self-esteem, a stutter, facial tic and a learning disability as a teenager before he turned his life around, winning the titles of "Mr. New Hampshire Male America" and Male America's "Mr. Personality." He also enlisted in the Marine Corps. The feedback from students and staff about his presentation has been very positive.

His talk was followed by a convocation on Oct. 26, organized by Becky Bailey, where two local residents spoke to students about making good choices and steering clear of drugs and alcohol. The convocation reinforced Yalden's message of making good choices to create the best life, and both presentations underscored Oregon-Davis' emphasis on character. Oregon-Davis encourages all our students to be BOBCATS: "Bringing Our Best Character, Attitude, Teamwork, and Scholarship!"
